Dear Parish Family and Friends, both near and far,

Parables were Jesus' favorite way to teach. Not by applying rules and regulations, but because he knew that his stories would appeal to our imagination. It was his way of saying, "Hey, think about this one...or let's reflect on this part of your life...or draw your own conclusions." This was certainly the case with today's parable. With the hope of drawing the listeners into deeper issues, Jesus offers us an opportunity to think about our values, plans, pet projects, and how we look at life.

Jesus opens his parable: "There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest." Who wouldn't want to be in that guy's shoes? So much security and well-being! Plus too much harvest and too little barn space! Who wouldn't want that "problem?" It's as if you have won the Power Ball; and you were the only winner; and, your only "problem" was how to spend it. But here's the twist: just when the man is lulled into comfortable thoughts and is making plans and projects — "Surprise! This night your life shall be taken from you, and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?"

One of this man's problems was that there was no one else in his world; no family, no friends, no advisors; he is a person talking to himself. There's no human community in any of his considerations. The man's sole and chief advisor was himself: a "fool." In one way or another, we are all part of some kind of community. Others must be involved in our decisions, especially if they are affected by them. Others need to be part of our concern. When we decide to get "more," what are the consequences for our family, friends, community and environment?

That man was deluded by his possessions. He thought they guaranteed his present and future happiness. He called his possessions "good things." But others who have less: those who are without the man's "good things," they may be very rich in "what matters to God." Maybe that could be our thought of the day: what matters to God? What am I supposed to be doing about it? What does it mean to be "rich in God's sight?"

Maybe being "rich in what matters to God" means: not deciding important matters on my own; not putting my trust in things that won't last; maybe it's seeing possessions in the light of others' needs; maybe thinking about what God might want before I act; maybe reflecting on the cost my decisions are to others; counting as true riches my relationships with others, and how they are affected by my life choices.

No matter how much I have, I come to Eucharist hungry and thirsty for God and for God's ways. I am grateful for real blessings: certainly for enough food and drink and the nourishing gifts of the Earth. But also for the faith that gives me a clear vision to know when enough is enough, and who and what my real treasures are.







