Hello to all—

I have been asked to submit another article for this newsletter. So, once again please be patient as I reflect on topics to provide insight from my own learning experiences as a Priest.

I will share this message for all to contemplate. As a broad question how many actually read the Scriptures before attending Mass in preparation for Sunday. The reason I ask is that shortly after I was Ordained I attended a Priest Retreat. Having been in sales and management in my previous life journey, I was comfortable with speaking with anyone even if I didn't know them.

There was a group of retired Priests sitting at a table during a lunch break and I approached the table asking why they were separated from the gathering of the other tables. They replied and you are "who" — to which I replied I'm Fr Pat, and how long have you been ordained — to which I replied "I think it's been 4 months." They collectively replied someday you will understand. However, I was persistent and asked if they had any advice— to which one of them replied, Yes, he stated has Scripture come alive for you? I shook my head not understanding what he was asking and proceeded to walk away.

Fast forward 5 years later and Scripture began to come alive for me, each Sacred Word resonated like never before. I was able to understand Sacred Scripture in an entirely new "light," the gift of the Holy Spirit began to magnify the true meaning of what was written so long ago. This new found energy helped me to better connect with the Lord's messages from so long ago.

My suggestion is to take a few minutes to read Sacred Scripture before Sunday Mass. Let the Holy Spirit envelope you with a deeper appreciation for what you hear proclaimed from the Altar on Sunday so, that the conversation between the Lord and you takes on a new dimension.

Pilgrims of Hope...Disciples on Mission Diocesan Jubilee Gathering




Saturday, September 20, 2025 –8:30 AM to 2 PM St. Matthew's Church 25 Mountainview Street, Voorheesville, NY 12186

All parishioners, pastors, associate pastors, parish life directors/coordinators, trustees, pastoral councils, finance councils, and leaders of parish ministries will benefit from this day of prayer and inspiration as we embark on this time of visionary discernment for our diocese. As Pope Benedict XVI said, we are all "co-responsible for the Church's being and action!"

Keynote: Pilgrims of Hope - Disciples on Mission

Being a disciple of Christ on mission today calls us to be pilgrims of hope in the Church and in the world. We are following Christ ourselves, but we are also sent by him to accompany people to a deeper life in him in the community of faith, the Church. This keynote address will focus on the aspects of what it means to be a pilgrim of hope and a disciple on mission, how we are called by our Baptism to go forth, spreading the Good News, and leading others to a fuller life of faith.

Session 2: Living as Missionary Disciples: Remade for Mission

Inspired by the teachings of the Second Vatican Council and the popes of the last sixty years, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has developed a guide for pastoral planning called *Living as Missionary Disciples: A Resource for Evangelization*. The Catholic Apostolate Center provided extensive consultation on this document. Fr. Frank will present on the theological and spiritual background of the document and offer ways in which the methods and principles from it can be implemented, especially as the Diocese of Albany embarks on the Remade for Mission process.

A Note from the St. Patrick's Finance Committee

The St. Patrick's Finance Committee recently received a note of possible confusion about the financial report from a parishioner. St. Patrick's pays for our own employees which is reflected under Salaries/Stipends. In addition to this St. Patrick's has regular monthly bills for our parish (i.e. fuel, snow removal, utilities) that are paid directly from our parish funds.

Each parish within the network pays for 1/8 of the salaries and benefits for the clergy and lay staff shared by the whole network. St. Patrick's pays the same amount as the other parishes and has from the establishment of the network. Also, St. Patrick's gets reimbursed for our Faith Formation coordinator whom we share, not with the whole network, but with Coxsackie, Athens, and Catskill, with each community reimbursing us based on the numbers of students enrolled in Faith Formation.

We hope this clarifies the concerns that were raised. The finance committee is available anytime to answer questions you may have.




