### How were you called to the priesthood?

I talked in October about how my family planted the seeds of faith within me, and how after working in the tire industry for 27 years I began attending daily Mass and saying the Rosary. I may have been slow to it, but I was catching on! Over time in my renewed prayer life, I began to think God was calling me to still more – it was time to explore if I should be a priest. Maybe I could even do so closer to my Mom. But I had to tell her first.

I called my older sister Mary Jane — a numerary with Opus Dei, residing in Boston. I knew she could help me with the best approach to tell Mom about my aspirations. She had but one question for me, however: "Do you have a spiritual director?" I responded "What is that?" She finished the call by saying "Good Luck" with Mom!

I arrived at my Mom's house that Friday in time for dinner. Afterwards we sat chatting on the couch, and I told her I have something to tell you. I said I was thinking about becoming a priest. Her immediate response was "How is your job going?" I replied awesome — best it's been and growing. We discussed the process, and then she said, "I always pictured you as a missionary."

I told her I had an appointment with the Vocation Director in Newark, scheduled for the next morning. To which she replied, Newark you live and own a home in Albany NY, why are you starting in Newark? I expressed the desire to be closer to her during my studies.

Mom was right as usual, of course - I may have thought I had a plan, but this was not about what I might plan. The appointment the next morning went sadly, as I recall. The Vocations Director was running late, and started with "I cannot ask you how old you are, but are you older than 40?"

Of course I was. He said Newark could not afford to offer me anything, but pointed me back home, to the Albany Diocese where they have a program for second career vocations. He said contact their Vocations Director and I was off to my next adventure. I left with a smile on my face!

What I hadn't realized was that anyone over 50 is considered to be on their second career when becoming a priest — although I don't think that is a steadfast rule for every diocese. So, I had a new opportunity ahead — more to come!

#### **Weekly Justice Challenges for Advent!**

#### December 7, 2025 ● 2nd Week of Advent

The first reading for the Second Sunday of Advent is from the prophet Isaiah. It includes these words: "Then the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the young lion shall browse together...There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy land; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord..." (Isaiah 11:1-10). Isaiah portrays a powerful image of cooperation and peace in this reading. Your challenge this week is to go to the Catholic Relief Services website, read a real-life story of people helping people, research the work which CRS is doing to bring peace and justice to our world, and choose one action you can take as a family or household to support the work of this great organization (www.crs.org/peacebuilding).

#### December 14, 2025 • 3rd Week of Advent

Sunday's Gospel has Jesus answering the question of who he is by stating: "Go back and report to John what you hear and see: the blind recover their sight, cripples walk, lepers are cured, the deaf hear, dead men are raised to life, and the poor have the good news preached to them" (Mt. 11:2-11). Jesus equates his very identity with care for the poor and marginalized. Your challenge this week is to identify the blind, the lepers, and the poor in your life. Discuss one particular person in need whom God is calling you and your family to serve. Select an action you can do for this person, just as Jesus did. And remember that Pope Francis said that having a friend who is poor is a pathway to heaven. So... just do it!




