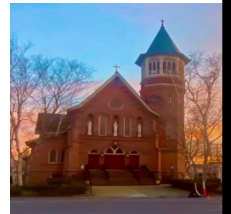

What was your path to the priesthood like?

In my last article, I told you how the Vocation Director in Newark directed me back home to Albany. So off I traveled to Albany to meet with the Vocation Director here. We set up a time several weeks later to meet in person and discuss the process. He started with some pointed questions.

Do you have a job? Yes, I replied, as I was still currently employed full time. No one at work had any idea that this was something I was pursuing. He replied you will need to leave your job because this commitment is a full time endeavor. My reply was that this would not be a problem, as I was looking for a change.

Do you own a house? Yes, I replied. I was the proud owner of a property with 3 apartments. I lived in one and rented the other two. He responded you will have to sell the property. I asked why. He explained, "You cannot be in class or on assignment and get a call the boiler broke down and have to leave to handle this issue." I smiled because that had actually occurred the year before while traveling on a business trip. He was right; the house had to go.

Do you own a car? Of course, I replied. He asked what kind of a car. Now I hesitated, because it was a BMW X3, although I had purchased the car second hand. I admitted it was a pre-owned BMW, to which he immediately responded, "You have to sell that; you cannot pull up to a parish office driving a BMW."

I immediately agreed, but asked to be allowed to keep the car for now. After all, if I got approved for seminary in the Boston area, how would I get back and forth to Albany without a car? He agreed the car could continue to be mine until completion of my degree.

I began to realize these questions were going to take more time to determine my course of action. There were many aspects to consider — was I really ready for these major changes or was more time needed to discern?

Weekly Justice Challenges!

January 4, 2026 - Epiphany

This week we commemorate the Epiphany, the story of the wise men from the east paying homage and bringing gifts to the Infant Jesus. Their presence in the stable reveals that Jesus came for all people, not just the Jewish community. But the faith of the wise men was almost thwarted by Herod, who sought to destroy the baby he had heard was born. Your challenge this week is to reflect on how often you turn to violence – violent words, violent actions, violent feeling – when you feel threatened by someone. Make a personal commitment to respond to other people's anger or hate or meanness with nonviolence. Pledge to make love the underlying motive and foundation on which you resolve your conflicts.

January 11, 2026 – Baptism of the Lord

The first reading for the Baptism of the Lord has the Prophet Isaiah proclaiming that the Messiah “shall bring forth just to the nations”. Jesus fulfilled that passage by being a person of justice and teaching his disciples that all people deserve to be treated fairly and with dignity, including the poor, the sick and lame, the outcasts and sinners. Your challenge this week is to find a way to say “yes” to your baptismal call, just as Jesus said yes to his. What is Jesus calling you to do to live out your baptism? What injustice in your family or community or world are you being called to combat? And what can you do to help end it?

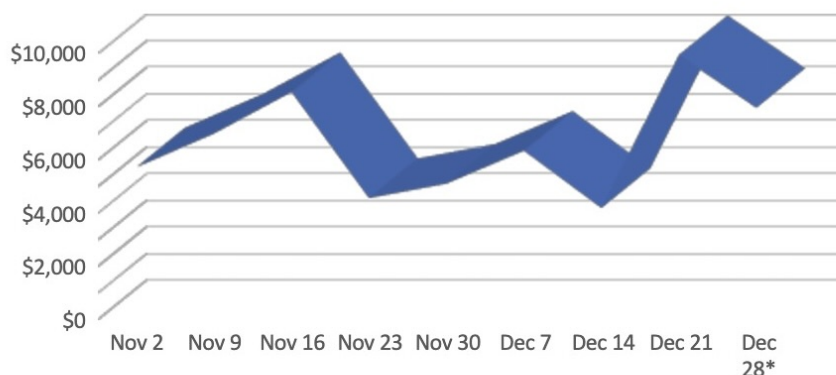

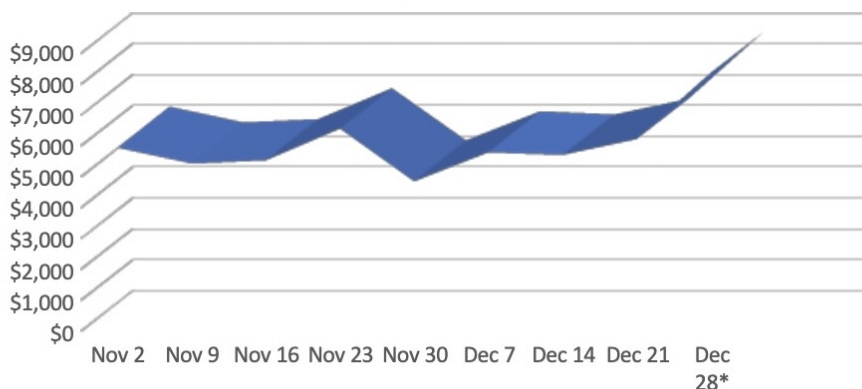
