


ST. MARY'S & ST. PATRICK'S NEWSLETTER





Dear Parish Family and Friends, both near and far,

"Do you remember me...?" Asked the man who stood before me. I knew he looked familiar, but I couldn't quite place the face. I had crossed the street to offer assistance after seeing that he needed it; his car had stalled, and it needed a jump-start.

He reminded me that we had met at a restaurant the night before, and we talked a bit as we remedied the situation and got his car started. As the conversation continued, he began to talk about his faith. As he did, I perceived a familiar and welcome sense of purpose that indicated to me that, yet again, God's plan was unfolding at that very moment.

In this past Sunday's Gospel, Jesus uses the Parable of the Good Samaritan to illustrate to a scholar of the law (and to us) the way in which we are to treat our neighbors with mercy. If we look closely, we see that Jesus' telling of this parable is in answer to an "attack" of sorts. The scholar "...stood up to test Jesus," and "...wished to justify himself," the Gospel tells us. In this light, we can be tempted to see the scholar as a sort of villain, but Jesus, as he always does, "...causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." (Romans 8:28). As the result of the scholar's testing of Jesus, we are given an example of the love and mercy we are called to provide to our neighbor. In a similar way, as the result of a stalled car and a little bit of willingness and action, an opportunity for me to witness God's grace at work was made manifest on this particular evening.

As our conversation progressed, the man indicated that he had once had a much greater faith. He spoke of taking mission trips, and of studying God's word with fervor and zeal. He admitted that it had been a long time since he had practiced his faith the way he once did, but also admitted that, lately, he felt drawn back to the church. He inquired about which churches we served, and about Mass times. At one point, he said that he was glad to be having this conversation. "Well," I said, "there's a gift wrapped in every problem."

Sometimes, the problem is a stalled car. Sometimes, as in the parable, it is an ill-treated traveler in need of help and healing. When we view any of life's myriad experiences and encounters (from minor inconveniences to major challenges and beyond) with the eyes of faith, we can be ready to receive the gifts that our heavenly Father longs to give us. These gifts are there, despite the problematic appearance of their packaging, but we need to reach out to receive them. So, as we move through the day today, let's remember the willingness and action on the part of the Good Samaritan. Let's be ready to reach out when we feel that familiar and welcome sense of purpose that accompanies the presence of the Holy Spirit. When we do, we can be sure that God's gifts await us.


