

Fr. Scott's Sharing Spot

Dear Parish Family....

Today I'd like to gratefully look back to a remarkable accomplishment we just had as a community and look forward to Christmas.

And here are the results! **500** cars came, making it a SELL-OUT success! (And the Coeymans Police made sure that it all flowed smoothly.) We are so grateful to George McHugh, Sr. & Family, who donated all the expenses of the meal to St. Patrick's in memory of their beloved late wife and mother **Anne Deflumer McHugh**, the supper raised **\$8,383** for St. Patrick's!

Frese's Catering & Bakery cooked us a delicious dinner and topped it off with their unbeatable homemade rolls and bread. Members of the Knights of Columbus came to help out along with many other parish volunteers and staff, and still others gave donations to make the event a success. And our tireless chairperson, Donna Hagen, conducted the whole orchestra and offered countless hours of her time to make it the success that it was.

I beamed with "pastor pride" (which is what gives me an inside glimpse of parents' feelings when looking with delight upon their kids) as I watched our parish family and our supporters from St. Mary's use our faith and ingenuity to convert a time-tested supper format we've used for decades into the creative and successful afternoon that it was. Thank you to one and all who made it such a delightful event in the midst of a challenging time.

Now, after looking back at a Spaghetti Supper that was like none we've ever seen before, let's look ahead to a Christmas that has no precedent! This year Christmas is on a Friday, which actually is a wonderful day of the week for it to be during a Pandemic, because that will allow us to celebrate our Christmas Masses not just on Christmas Day and Christmas Eve, but **over the course of four days: December 24-27.**

Based on the trends we've been seeing with attendance at our Masses, it looks like these six Mass times over four days should accommodate everyone who is comfortable attending a public Mass and allow us not to turn away any visitors or newcomers:

Our goal is to allow you to choose which Mass you'd like to attend ahead of time, to offer you a reserved spot in a pew for your family (with social distance and all the fixin's) and to assign you tickets for that spot so that you can be assured of your place. You may already be familiar with this concept, since many parishes choose to use a ticket system every year, but in our case, it is simply a prudent procedure for Coronavirus times. Because the obligation to attend Mass in person on Christmas has been suspended this year, you could choose to attend one Christmas Mass on Thursday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday.

At all six Masses over the course of those four days we will be using Christmas season readings and singing Christmas songs. To make room for everyone who wants to come celebrate

Christmas, we'd ask you to come just one time over the course of those four days. And to make it easy, there will be no A-L or M-Z Masses, we just ask that you attend your home parish (not the sister parish) this Christmas so we have room for all and can still maintain social distance. This way you can plan to easily and safely incorporate Mass into your family Christmas celebrations.

We will give all parishioners an equal chance to sign up for a Mass. The week of Nov. 14-15, all parishioners at the M-Z Masses will have a chance to put a paper request for the number of family members in the collection box. The week of Nov. 21-22, all parishioners at the A-L Mass will have a chance to do the same. Once all those regular Mass attendees have a chance to choose their preferred Mass time and day, we'll begin making the seating chart and confirming the reservation with all those parishioners.



Then, as Advent begins, we will open up the rectory phone lines to anyone who would like to request a reservation in the remaining space. We are also developing plans for what to do if the demand to attend those Masses exceeds the number of seats we can provide. Never fear – we'll have you covered!

The one thing **we wish we could provide but that we can't this year** is the flexibility to allow you to "just show up" for one of these Masses without a ticket. Normally, if you said: "*I don't have a ticket, but I'll stand in the aisle, I don't mind at all,*" we'd be happy to welcome you inside. But for obvious reasons, this year that's not possible. And how horribly sad it would be to have to turn someone away on Christmas!

Having you at Christmas Mass will be a delight for us and for you; we just all need everyone to make a plan ahead of time in order to pull it off as safely and calmly as possible. I am always grateful to be the pastor of two such open, flexible, invested and faith-filled parish communities. I give thanks to God every day for you!


