

Fr. Scott's Sharing Spot

Dear Parish Family,

Being a church leader during this era we are living in when church has become less important in the lives of many Americans than it ever was before is challenging. But COVID-19 has redefined the meaning of the word "challenge." How to remain a church family when we can't gather together has been a particularly hard pill to swallow.

One Catholic organization, The National Conference for Catechetical Leadership (NCCL) has suggested that we take one page from the military's book on facing threats and struggles. They say that in their training, military leaders learn the acronym VUCA to prepare for leading others in the most challenging circumstances. VUCA stands for:

Volatility – rapid rate of change

Uncertainty – lack of clarity, predictability, certainty concerning the future

Complexity - multiplicity of decision factors

Ambiguity – there may be no "right" answers or even "best practices" to turn to

The term "crisis" is appropriate for the times we're living in for a number of reasons. Not only does it describe the feeling of having our lives turned upside down, but, fascinatingly, in Mandarin Chinese, the word crisis is created by bringing two other words together:

danger and opportunity.

A crisis is a dangerous opportunity.

This explains why, in many ways, a crisis is what you make of it.

For some, crisis can be a time to retreat or withdraw to just get through it. For others can be a time of creativity, innovation and exploration of new possibilities for the future. I'm delighted to say that, in most ways, our two parishes are on that second path.

In this VUCA era, we are striving to embrace a leadership stance described as "VUCA 2.0," which shape-shifts that acronym to describe the opportunity present in crisis. VUCA 2.0 is...

Vision – Despite rapid change, clarify, focus, and communicate the vision.

Understanding – Question and challenge the status quo. Strengthen empathy. Listen to the hopes, dreams, and desires of people. Have an open mind to new ideas. Accept constructive criticism.

Clarity – Cut the fat. Focus on core essentials for the ministry.


Agility & Adaptability – Adapt quickly and make decisions. Innovate. Risk. Learn from failed attempts and try again.

As New York slowly reopens in as safe and prudent a way as possible, we are working behind the scenes to work out the best procedures to make your return to Mass as safe as possible. A project team is being assembled of parishioners who are health care professionals and organizational leaders so we can take the protocols being given to us by the State and the Diocese and apply them to our two churches in the best ways possible.

We already know that things will be different for a long time as we face reduced capacity for Masses and lots of added protections, but the opportunity to gather together again will make it worth all the effort and inconvenience.

We are asking God for the VISION to see how best to accomplish the work being given to us and are committed to keep communicating that to you as clearly as possible. We wish to listen to scientists, medical professionals and leaders to UNDERSTAND the big picture of what we're facing. We want to focus with CLARITY on the core of our mission and work on what will best help our parishioners and neighbors get through this Pandemic, and we will continue to ADAPT as we need to so we can keep effectively meeting the real needs we face.

God could have chosen for us to be born at any time in history, and God chose us for these times. May we rise to meet the moment and conduct all our affairs in a way that gives glory to God.

All my kids do online banking & it took me a few years to try it & now I really like it...
