Keeping us connected during the Coronavirus Pandemic

Fr. Scott's Sharing Spot

Dear Parish Family....

Fall is on the inbound track. Pumpkin is the flavor everyone is choosing, school is going back in session and you now need to remember to bring a jacket with you when you're going out for the evening.

Among the things that happen every fall is a new year of Faith Formation for our young people. At both St. Patrick's and St. Mary's, figuring out how to accomplish this during Coronavirus has been a big puzzle that we began working on early in the summer. Christa and Bob have been attending webinars with national catechetical* leaders, brainstorming with Diocesan officials, reaching out to parents to find out their needs and hopes, consulting with our faithful volunteer catechists* and taking their cues from the plans of the C-A and RCS and the other school districts attended by our students.

* *Catechetical* means acquiring and learning about faith; *catechists* are teachers of faith

Unlike our schools, which have options that allow them to offer families a choice between virtual, in-person or combination learning, our parish situation limits us to offering families input on what format would please them most in light of what each catechist feels able and comfortable to provide as well as the physical space we have to provide it. It pains us to not be able to offer a customized plan for each child in our program, but obviously that's not possible.

However, an incredibly exciting opportunity came about during this planning process through the work of the Holy Spirit – an opportunity to use already existing YouTube content that relates directly to our parish and community as well as our weekly Mass.

Out of the blue, Michael Elacqua, a Holy Cross College junior majoring in Social Work, asked me if he could devote eight weeks of his required summer internship working for our parishes. He was the answer to our prayer, and spent many hours watching all of the online content on our YouTube channels dating back to 2015 (which you can find by clicking [here](#)) and sorting it into playlists based on topics like: Faith, Commitment, Trusting in God, The Sacraments, Relationships and many others.

These playlists allow us to have our youth connect directly with the actual stories and messages that we've used at Mass and online to inspire people's faith. Can you imagine how cool it will be for catechists to connect the foundations of our faith to messages from weekend homilies, "Profiles of Endurance" interviews and other posts that I have produced for the parish? Can you imagine the way parents could now also engage in that content so they can have productive family discussions on faith topics that directly connect to everyday life? It's very cutting edge and so exciting!

As we discussed new strategies, we also wondered if there were ways we could make life easier for the families that are so burdened by the struggles of these times. We unanimously decided as a staff and as parish finance councils that there indeed is something we can do to show parents how much we care about their children and are striving to understand the COVID struggles they face: **going forward, we will waive all fees for faith formation.**

We feel this is the right decision and shows that we value Faith Formation as an essential human need for a young person and their family. It is therefore a moral duty for us to provide that, no matter their financial situation. We know that our parishioners and virtual parish family members donate generously to the needs of our parishes and, knowing this decision, are likely to be willing to supplement their offerings to cover the \$3,000 annual cost that will fall on each parish in order to provide this small but heartfelt relief.

We are very excited to engage our students and families in new and creative ways using content directly related to our parish and parishioners! And even more excited to offer it at no cost, marking this new territory in a meaningful way.

We are so grateful for the faithful and faith-filled leadership of Bob and Christa and really hope you can support them and the students they serve with your prayers and support.

While pursuing her Ph.D. at Union Seminary in New York City, Kim composed the *Welcome Table: A Mass of Spirituals*, along with composer M. Roger Holland II. 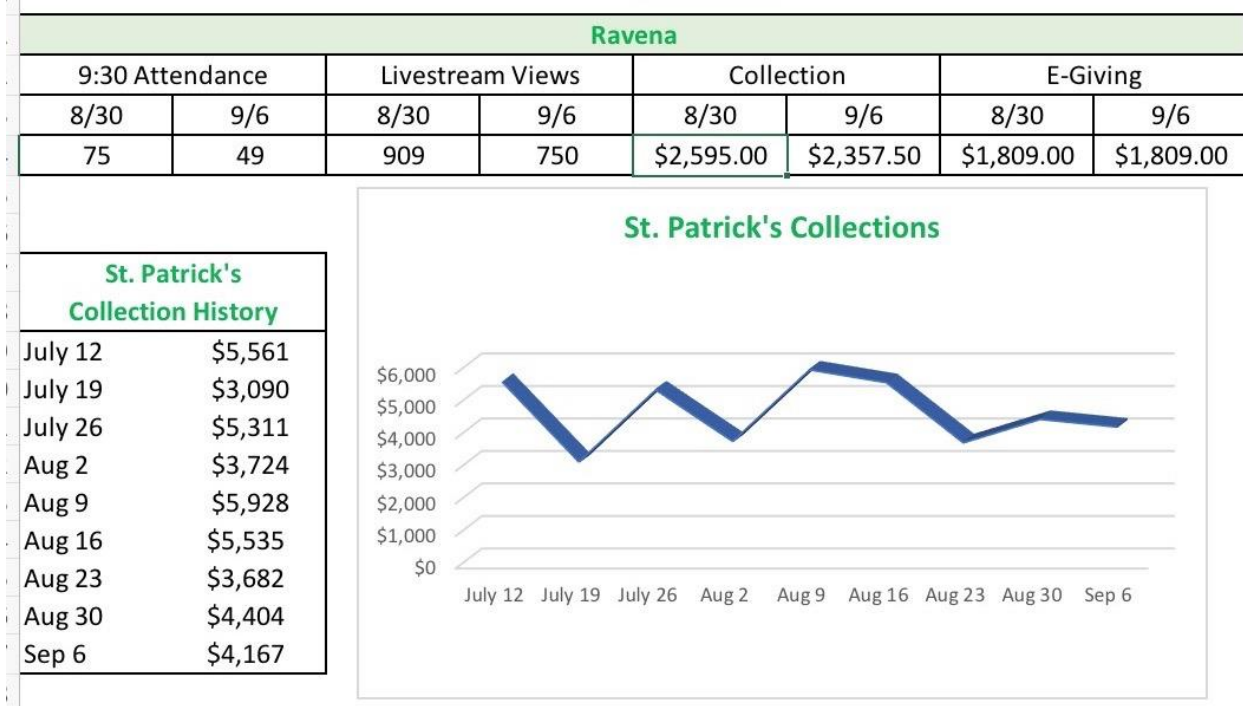
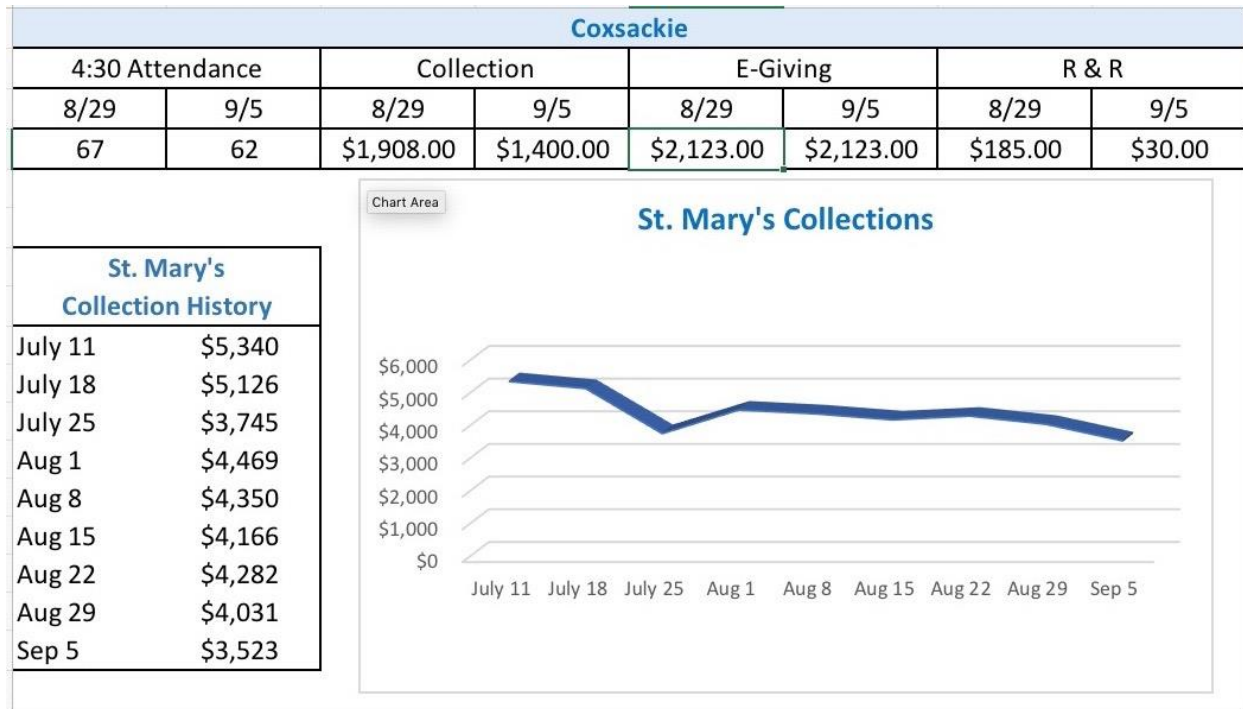

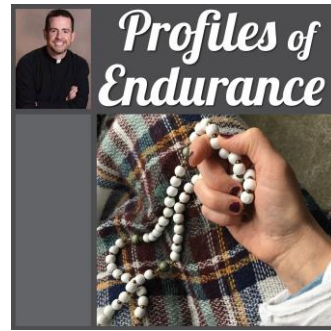
