Is Catholic Social Teaching something new?

Much electronic buzz and ink have been spent recently on Catholic social teachings, both in Catholic and secular media. In fact, they have been hot topics since the start of the pontificate of Pope Leo, were raised again at the November 2025 meeting of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (*USCCB*), and as well as by the second administration of the US by Donald Trump.

Social teachings of the Church **are rooted in sacred scripture, particularly the Gospel**; they are not a new invention. Theologians throughout Church history have tackled these teachings. The Industrial Revolution and its subsequent less humane consequences required a renewed application of this ancient tradition. In 1891, Pope Leo XIII offered an encyclical *Rerum Novarum*, "Of New Things." He sought to gain a better understanding, clarity, of God's will in a new situation.

Since the issuance of *Rerum Novarum*, each Pope has addressed the pressing social concerns of their day. Pope Leo XIV, our current Pope, released his first Apostolic Exhortation *Dilexi Te,* "*I Have Loved You,*" urging love for the poor.

Today, as in the past, we as a Church, a diocese, a vicariate, a parish, our families, and ourselves are thrust into new situations. Increasingly, these situations have little or no precedent in our life experiences. However, we are not alone. God is with us. As Father Mike Melanson likes to say: "God loves us so much that there is nothing we can do about it." As a Church we have scripture, the example and teachings of Jesus, as well as the gift of Jesus at Pentecost – the Holy Spirit.

We are called to be our sister's and brother's keeper, no matter where they are — or what choices they have made. Blame is not part of love. Stuff happens in each of our lives which we can't always foresee or control. The social teachings of the Church insist to us that **God creates humanity in the divine image and likeness and longs to adopt each one of us as a beloved child.** When looking at another person — no matter who they are, in agreement with us or not — we must see a reflection of God.



Weekly Justice Challenges for Advent!

November 30, 2025 ● 1st Week of Advent

The first reading for this Sunday is one with which we are familiar. It is the passage from the Book of Isaiah (2:1-5) describing what the world will be like when the Messiah comes. The image of people beating swords into plowshares—taking instruments used to kill people and changing them into instruments which help grow food to feed people—is a powerful one. Your challenge in this first week of Advent is to spend some time reflecting on how you are peacemakers (as a family and as individuals). Do you bring people together by your words and actions or do you create conflict? Then decide on one action you can take to make the world a more peace-filled place. Do you want to pray for peace in our world, our country, and our families? Do you want to write to government leaders to advocate for a more peaceful approach to a particular issue? Do you want to take a stand for more gun control? How do you want to bring peace?




