ooking for Answers

Why go to church?

At one of my last parishes I was assigned to, I served as High School Youth Minister. It was a position I held for many years and I found it both rewarding and challenging. Not challenging in the typical way – being around noisy, rambunctious, energetic students – as I find that very rewarding. But, in the way that we can be challenged by others, in what we believe as Catholics and why we believe in what we do.

On many occasions I would find myself in a discussion with a student who would ask the question: "Why go to church?" Their questioning would commonly follow a similar format, one that I believe many of us can relate to.

They might start the conversation/argument by saying something like, "Why do I need to go to Mass? I like to pray outside, on a walk, down at the lake. I don't need to be in a building to do that." My response would be one of compassion and validation. I too enjoy praying in nature. I find it a great time to really listen to God, to slow my mind down, block out the noise and just listen. I might then ask them a follow up question: "What do you think God is speaking to you about?"

Most of the time, they wouldn't answer the question directly, but instead switch tactics. "Why go to church – most of the people there are hypocrites! My friend's dad got drunk and got in a fight (or some other variation of a disturbing act), but he was at church this morning, acting like nothing happened." My response would often be one of concern and to acknowledge that it must have been scary for their friend and the friend is lucky to have someone like them to talk to.

They might respond also, "My parents are forcing me to go to church, and I don't want to be here." Most of us understand this emotion. Who among us doesn't rebel against being forced to do something, to do something we don't feel in control of, even if it is good for us. My feeble attempt to answer them, or even myself, would be by asking a series of questions: do your parents force you to attend school, make you eat properly, go to the dentist, get enough sleep?

I wish I had all the answers, but I don't. I do know that we can be our own worst enemy and I can't do this alone. The only real answer for me is that I need to be in communion with all of God's children.




