Fr. Scott's Sharing Spot

Dear Parish Family....

A year ago this weekend, we were beginning three months in the desert. As Coronavirus swept over our communities and over the world, all Masses were cancelled, all gatherings taken away, and before long, the losses from COVID deaths came closer and closer. As we mark a year of this experience, let us acknowledge what a challenging and painful spiritual journey this has been. Not only have more than 20 parishioners died of the disease, countless lives have been changed for more reasons that I can capture here and few that need any explanation. We've been through the ringer.

Many parishioners have told me that this experience has taught them faith is about a lot more than going to Mass on Sunday. So many individuals in our parish have, to their surprise, found this time to be the biggest period of spiritual growth they have ever experinced. Their forced fast from the Eucharist made them appreciate Mass more, listening to Podcasts and spiritual content deepened their desire for holiness, joining a small prayer group changed their sense of "Church" forever.

It was 38 weeks ago at the tail-end of June that we once again celebrated Mass in Church for the first time. Getting ready for that was like building a railroad from scratch: we needed a brand-new plan for everything!

Because of the way our pews are spaced, the social distancing rules required us to cut our capacity in half so we could leave every other pew free, and the two seats between households at Mass cut that down further to about 30% tops.

We had to recruit a ton of volunteers to make

Mass possible: to sanitize before people arrived, to sign people in, to seat people safely, to sanitize afterwards. We redesigned the way communion was distributed, the way people moved in the church, the way everything worked. Every Mass was a significant undertaking.

It wasn't feasible to pull that off four times every weekend, so we cut the Mass schedule back to two Masses and had to decide how to make sure no one got turned away. We didn't want to institute a reservation system because Jesus taught that "The last shall be first" (Matthew 20), and a reservation system, by definition, lets the *first* be first, which troubled us. We also didn't want our volunteer office receptionists to be swamped with reservation calls every week, so we created a system that allowed every parishioner to come to Mass twice a month by inviting people by last names (A-L and M-Z on rotation). Since the usual Catholic regulation to follow

God's 3rd Commandment by attending Mass every weekend was temporarily suspended by the U.S. Catholic Bishops because of the contagiousness of COVID, and because our 9:30 livestream Mass from St. Patrick's is so easy to access, our parishioners handled that with tremendous graciousness. (It's a big part of what makes being your pastor such a joy!)

At Christmas, we knew that a large number of people would want to come to Mass, so to make that possible we created an "overflow" area for the crowd that could not fit in the main church to be able to join in real time and receive communion. We also decided that this was a situation when having people make reservations, despite our misgivings, would be for the greater good. We made a seating chart for each Mass that maximized the use of every pew and make sure that there was some space for out-of-towners and ensured that no one would be turned away. It was a lot of work, but it worked great and everyone, again, was so gracious.

Because Holy Week is the most important week of the year for Catholics, we're going do that same thing for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. Everyone is invited to fill out a reservation form and we will do what we need to in order for everyone to go to Mass.



Now that more people are being vaccinated, we're seeing higher attendance each week, which delights us. It's causing more people to ask when we will return to our regular Mass schedule. You'll be happy to hear that we do indeed plan to return to that schedule as soon as possible, but we can't yet know when that will be for two reasons:

- (1) Because the necessary social distance regulations take time and a LOT of volunteers, we can't return to that schedule until those regulations are relaxed (at least in part).
- (2) The usual weekly "Mass Obligation," the Catholic regulation to follow God's 3rd Commandment, is still temporarily suspended by the U.S. Catholic Bishops, but at some point, it will be reinstated. If we jump the gun on returning to a regular Mass schedule, we will offer people a mixed message on the moral duty to attend Mass. Right now, it is wise to stay home and participate at Mass by watching the livestream. One day, coming "in person to the altar" as a sign of love and faithfulness will again be something all Catholics are asked to do each week. Waiting, so that our reopening coincides with that date, seems to be the most sensible choice as of now.

In the meantime, we're launching a new Livestream channel on YouTube – this time for St. Mary's 4:30 Mass! You can find it here, and then please hit SUBSCRIBE so you'll always be connected. The new railroad we've been building continues to expand... and grace is its cargo!




