Faith Seekers: Our new program for Grades K-4 Faith Formation On the weekend of September 30/October 1, we will be launching a new approach to Faith Formation designed to reach our youngest disciples in a way that will really hit home. For those in Kindergarten through to Fourth Grade Faith Formation will be happening **during Mass**. At first that may sound different, but the benefits, it makes perfect sense.

All children in Kindergarten through Fourth Grade will be invited to leave their parents in the pews for 25-30 minutes during Mass so they can be **Faith Seekers**. Visiting children can join in the fun and learning as well. There's room for everyone who would like to come, and, although we need those in the program to register, there is no charge for anyone, including visitors. All are welcome.

After we sing the Gloria and open with a prayer, our priest or deacon will call the children forward for a blessing. Then their Catechist will bring them to the meeting space for 25-30 minute carefully tailored time with today's Gospel and an interactive activity. These sessions will begin and end with the prayer, reinforcing very familiar Catholic prayers. This will leave them wanting more when they return to their parents at the Sign of Peace. Every child in this age group is welcome to come to Faith Seekers at every Mass: cousins, visitors, friends from school who slept over...everyone is welcome. And there is no charge. As Sunday's Gospel naturally changes every week, there is always something new. God's Word is good!




