A Word (or Two) From Fr. Joe

Dear Parish Family both near and far away,

I'd like to share four things with you:

First, in response to the surge of COVID/omicron virus, our parishes reinstated some of our former COVID protocols to maintain the safest environment we can for our parishioners. Effective last weekend: 1) Parishioners are reminded to wear their mask so it covers their nose, mouth and chin. 2) We reintroduced every other pew seating at our Masses. 3) There will be no procession to receive Communion. The deacon and I will bring you the Body of Christ by walking through the empty pews. 3) When Mass ends, we ask people to not stop and congregate in groups but to return home.

Second, the Diocese is inviting all who would like to participate in Pope Francis's worldwide synod to sign up online for 3 webinars over the next 3 weeks. These webinars are scheduled for the next three Tuesdays at 10 am and 7 pm. Here's the schedule: Tuesday, January 25th: "Part 1: A True Season of the Spirit;" Tuesday, February 1st: "Part 2: Walking and Listening Together;" and Tuesday, February 8th: "Part 3: All the Baptized – Co-responsible for Mission."

The Diocese is seeking the widest, most diverse audience possible to offer input and comments. I urge you to take part in this synod project. Third, in January, we often take time to recall our being a people and a church that respect life at all times. Let me draw from the words of Pope Francis's apostolic exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate (Rejoice and Be Glad)*: "Our defense of the innocent unborn needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the defense of a human life, which is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development. Equally sacred, however, are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery and every form of rejection." Pray we open people's hearts to all life.

Fourth, parishioners are using the envelopes we mailed out recently to replace those delayed in shipping. Thank you! Whether you put your envelope in the collection at Mass, or you've been at home sick, or have been quarantining, or you live far away and follow us online and have been sending them in, your generous stewardship helps provide so much to our parishioners and our community. With more people at home because of COVID and the rough winter weather, your stewardship makes a difference! Many thanks!

FAITH FORMATION 2022:

Please continue to pay attention to Faith Formation Schedules. If you haven't received the schedules for Grades K-6, Grades 7-9 and Grade 10, please contact Bob Desrosiers at stmaryffo@aol.com.

Grade 10/Confirmation Group: By now you should have chosen your sponsor. If they are from St. Mary's then you need to fill out the form for sponsors that has been handed out. If you still need one, ask Bob Desrosiers (stmaryffo@aol.com) for one. If the sponsor is from another Catholic Church, please ask the sponsor to get a certificate of sponsorship from their Church Administration Office (Rectory).

Grade 10/Confirmation Group: There will be a meeting for candidates and sponsors on **Sunday Feb. 13** following the 11:30 am Mass (around 12:45 pm) in the Church. If a sponsor can't make it, we ask a parent to come in their place.

Grade 2 Sacramental Preparation: There will be a meeting for parents on **Monday Feb. 7th** during class time (6:30 - 7:30 pm).

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: We hope to resume the Children's Lectionary Program (Children's Liturgy of the Word) at the 11:30 am Mass. Since the last time we offered this program, we have lost almost all of our Teen Catechists to graduation! Now we have 3 teams; it works best with 4 or 5 so that each team facilitates about once a month. If there are any youth (7th grade or higher) who wishes to serve in this capacity, please let Bob Desrosiers know. Use Your IRA to Support Your Parish: As we begin a new year it's good practice to look ahead and formulate a plan for our finances. For parishioners with Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA), there is an option available to you that permits you to support your parish and enjoy a tax benefit.

At age 72 Individual Retirement Account (IRA) owners must withdraw an annual required minimum distribution (RMD) from their accounts. These withdrawals are normally taxable pushing people into a higher tax bracket.

<u>Did you know you can make a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD) to a registered non-profit using the funds from your RMD?</u> Your Catholic Parishes are considered non-profits. QCDs are generally not considered taxable income and do count toward fulfilling your annual RMD. QCDs must be paid directly from your IRA to the charity of your choice. You can benefit regardless of whether you itemize or take the standard deduction. <u>Consult with your financial advisor for any questions you may have.</u>
