Dear Parish Family and Friends, both near and far,

Prayers of thanksgiving to the Holy Spirit for guiding the Cardinals in the selection of Pope Leo XIV as a successor to Pope Francis and successor to St. Peter! Let us pray for the new Holy Father and for God's People the Church! More than a few parishioners around our network told me how they followed the events of these days through televised coverage, from Pope Francis's funeral, to white smoke, to the announcement of a new Holy Father and his installation. You have heard about his Chicago roots, his ministry as an Augustinian missionary and Bishop in Peru, his service as Father General of the Augustinians and his work in the Roman Curia assisting Pope Francis in the selection of Bishops for dioceses around the world.

All times face challenges. Pope Leo XIV serves the People of God when there is violence around the world; at no time in human history have there been as many refugees as there are now. There is rising tension among the nations. People, especially in the West, seem to lack patience and understanding for their sisters and brothers. Emerging technologies have the potential to change the nature of work for so many, threatening the dignity of families and workers.

In these first two weeks of Leo XIV's pontificate, his words and actions have repeatedly referenced Resurrection, reconciliation, unity, peace and justice. His support of synodality speaks to a commitment to listening to each other as we seek to be Church for one another. Pope Leo will serve us and our world. Let us pray for him and with him.

Happy Memorial Day! At it's heart, Memorial Day is when we honor all who have died in service to our nation, defending our ideals and our way of life. Many visit cemeteries to decorate graves. (Do you remember Decoration Day?) Please devote some time to pray for those who have served our nation to advance freedom, democracy, peace and justice for all.


