A Word (or Two) From Fr. Joe

Dear Parish Family, both near and far away,

In our last newsletter, I wrote to you on Pope Francis' worldwide Synod on Synodality and our Diocese's next steps in making it possible for you to participate.

That phrase *Synod on Synodality* is quite a mouthful, isn't it? But what it means is that Pope Francis is seeking to hear from everyone (women and men, young and old, retired persons and workers and students, people who come to Mass every week and people who've been away for some time... everyone) on how the Church can share the word of Jesus in our world in a better way. How can we be Christ for others? How can we find ways to include all who feel left behind or are not welcomed as they should be? How can we create a more inviting Church in the midst of such a divided world? *Pope Francis wants our Church to be a listening Church*.

Perhaps this is not what you are used to... maybe you feel you do not have something to share. Please reconsider. Bishop Edward Scharfenberger says that "We are all part of the Body of Christ. Everyone has a role to play. Everyone has a place." Your participation matters.

Locally, a Synod Listening Session will be hosted at Holy Trinity's parish center in Hudson (429 East Allen Street) on Tuesday, May 24th from 6:30 - 8:30 pm. You will be invited to discuss four questions dealing with life in the Church. Deacon Mike McDonald will be part of the team who will keep the evening moving along so there will be time to be heard. 


Collection for Churches in Central and Eastern Europe
