

A Word (or Two) From Fr. Joe

Dear Parish Family, both near and far away,

Our brief celebration of Ordinary Time comes to a close soon as the beginning of Lent is just a few weeks away. Ash Wednesday is February 22nd this year. Easter Sunday is April 9th.

Here's how we will celebrate Ash Wednesday. Ashes will be available at all of our celebrations.

At St. Patrick's At St. Mary's

Mass at 7 am Morning Prayer at 8 am
Evening Prayer at 6 pm Midday prayer at 12 noon

Mass at 6 pm

After the 6 pm celebrations in both parishes, there will be an Ash Wednesday supper with soup and bread. Everyone is invited to come and enjoy a simple meal on this day of fast and abstinence to begin our Lenten journey. (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All Lenten Fridays are days of abstinence.)

Our local schools will be closed the week of Monday, February 20th. Parents and grandparents, please give some thought to bringing your children and grandchildren to church on Ash Wednesday. You can help them begin their Lenten celebration and help them form lifelong habits of faith.

A full schedule of Lenten activities in both of our parishes will appear in our next newsletter.

To assist with preregistration for one of our first Lenten events, please know that Michele Sisak will be returning to offer her Icon Retreat on the week of Monday, February 27th thru Friday, March 3rd at St. Patrick's. Come pray, paint and learn the ways of icons with Michele in a room filled with natural light that is just right for painting. She will be available from 9 am to 6 pm. She needs to order materials in advance, so please contact us through the parish offices if you're interested. The cost: \$60 for all materials needed to create your icon.

Three Faith Formation notes: First, please pray for our First Eucharist candidates at St. Patrick's who will be celebrating First Reconciliation on February 12th. Second, please watch for Souper Bowl of Giving canisters which will be distributed at weekend Masses by our young people. Your change will support local food pantries. Third, if any of our young people are interested in attending the National Catholic Youth Conference in Indianapolis this November, please contact Bob Desrosier at St. Mary's or Christa Desrosier at St. Patrick's. If you are a participant in Faith Formation and will be a high school student in the fall, you're eligible.

The St. Blaise blessing will take place during our Masses this weekend. Anointing of the Sick will be offered at St. Patrick's on Saturday, February 18th after the 4:30 Mass and at St. Mary's on Sunday, February 19th after the 11:30 Mass.

Loose palm can be left in receptacles in the back of the churches up until February 18th. *Please do <u>NOT</u> place plastic bags, rubber bands, twist ties or other similar items in the receptacles.*

Coxsackie – Athens Ecumenical Winterfest 2023: the Coxsackie-Athens Ecumenical Clergy Association is sponsoring its annual Ecumenical Winterfest on Sunday, February 19 at the Gospel Community Church. Folks gather around 4 pm to get seats and place their covered dish on the community table. Supper begins at 4:30 pm followed by presentations of music, scripture, poetry etc., by each church community. It is always a great, heartwarming celebration of Christian fellowship and unity in the middle of a cold winter. They will pray together, participate in discussion on topics such as Baptism, Being Sealed With the Holy Spirit, the Oil of Salvation, and Discipleship.


