





A Word (or Two) From Fr. Joe

Dear Parish Family, both near and far away,

Have you decided yet what practices to take on for Lent this year?

People participate in prayer, fasting and almsgiving... the three hallmarks of Lent. Often, special attention is placed on fasting. Just what will you fast on this Lent? Many fast from something comfortable. Others prefer not to fast but instead take something new on, introducing a new and positive practices or habit into your daily routine.

Why not do both? Let this item from the writings of William Ward offer guidance:

Fast from judging others; feast on Christ dwelling within them. Fast from emphasizing differences; feast on the unity of all life. Fast from apparent darkness; feast on the reality of light. Fast from words that pollute; feast on phrases that purify. Fast from discontent; feast on gratitude. Fast from anger; feast on patience. Fast from pessimism; feast on optimism. Fast from suspicion; feast on trust. Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation. Fast from negatives; feast on affirmatives. Fast from unrelenting pressures; feast on unceasing prayer. Fast from hostility; feast on nonviolence. Fast from bitterness; feast on forgiveness. Fast from self-centeredness; feast on compassion for others. Fast from today's anxiety; feast on eternal truth. Fast from discouragement; feast on hope. Fast from lethargy; feast on enthusiasm. Fast from thoughts that weaken us; feast on all that inspires. Fast from idle gossip; feast on purposeful silence. Fast from problems that overwhelm; feast on prayer that sustains.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence? Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. Abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday is required for Ages 18-59.




