Fr. Scott's Sharing Spot

Dear Parish Family...

Here we are, completing month #5 of business-not-at-all-as-usual. It seems that if the "Spanish Flu" Pandemic of 1918-19 is any indication, we will be operating under these challenging circumstances for some time.

It struck me recently as I looked at the 1917 cornerstone of St. Patrick's Church that just when our ancestors were justifiably patting themselves on the back for achieving the ambitious task of building a brand-new church, suddenly the world shut down. And the 18 months that followed were hard and incredibly inconvenient for everyone. And at that point, St. Mary's Church was turning 20 years old. So right around when they were noticing that the sanctuary carpet might need to be replaced before long, everything went kerflew.



Our goal is to return to more normal operations as soon as we safely can, but it would be wise for us to consider how we can get as comfortable as possible while we wait. And, let's face it, we're learning to do many tasks in our lives in new and sometimes better ways that will serve us well in the future.


For instance, many parishioners in both Coxsackie and Ravena have said that they appreciate having the newsletter coming in an electronic form rather than picking up a bulletin each week. This was never our master plan, but it does seem that the benefits of receiving parish news electronically has been an unexpected blessing of this time.

One of the things that we miss from our bulletins is the weekly attendance and offering figures. All of us are understandably curious about the parishes' financial health and a regular snapshot really helps us take the temperature of two important indicators of parish health. So starting this week, you'll find a table with that data listed for the past two weeks and a line graph that gives some indication of the trends that are happening. One new feature is a snapshot of how


many views our 9:30 livestream Mass has had, which is another remarkable blessing of this time. While our in-person attendance is usually around 20% of what it once was, our weekly virtual assembly is **4 times** what we expect in person on a normal weekend! (And it's actually most certainly more like **10 times that number**, since we used to count "heads" at Mass and YouTube counts the number of devices tuning in. Since some families have three, four or even 10 people watching at once on one device, the viewing crowd of virtual Masses are huge.) Please keep that remarkable phenomenon in mind when you watch the number of views in that column of the table.

Another feature of the bulletin at St. Patrick's that Ravena parishioners have been missing lately is the opportunity to honor deceased loved ones with a memorial remembrance. Just as the beautiful stained-glass windows of our churches were donated in honor of loved ones who have died, the Ravena bulletin always had a page of memorial squares that represented a virtual gift that others could view and share in when they read the bulletin.

The squares were featured in a special section of the bulletin and were available for a set donation that was given to the church to pay for the bulletin and other expenses. It was sort of like when loved ones of students in a school play donate money to offer words of encouragement and pride in the Playbill. This was something that allowed families to honor their loved ones and express their grief in a supportive community forum.



We are now working to also include those memorials remembrances in the newsletter. And we plan to open this option up to St. Mary's parishioners too, who, up until now, have had a much shorter bulletin (St. Patrick's bulletin was regularly 9 pages long, including the front and back covers.) Please expect more information on this coming soon and consider publicly honoring a loved one while supporting your parish at the same time with a memorial remembrance.



In time, the Spanish Flu no longer held sway over the lives of people and life resumed. Those who lived through it never forgot the experience.

Coronavirus will eventually no longer dominate every aspect of society and we will find innovative ways to overcome this trial. But we'll never forget the experience.

Albert Einstein said, "In the middle of every difficulty lies opportunity." May God point out to us the way we should travel. And may we have the wisdom and humility to follow God's directions.


*If we become too lax with how we follow our procedures,

- If you are serving in music, lector or other ministry and are not the 'letters' for that week, we welcome your family members to attend, if there are seats available - again please have them wait until a few minutes before Mass to get a seat.

We are just starting to reach our capacity at each Mass, we have not had to turn anyone away yet. However, as more people decide they would like to attend, we want to make sure we are all following the same procedures to give the most possible parishioners the opportunity to attend.




