GOSPEL PASSAGE


SHARING QUESTIONS

## READING 1

A reading from a letter of Paul to the Ephesians

Brothers and sisters:

You were once darkness,  
but now you are light in the Lord.

Live as children of light,  
for light produces every kind of goodness  
and righteousness and truth.

Try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord.

Take no part in the fruitless works of darkness;  
rather expose them, for it is shameful even to mention  
the things done by them in secret;

but everything exposed by the light becomes visible,  
for everything that becomes visible is light.

Therefore, it says:

*“Awake, O sleeper,  
and arise from the dead,  
and Christ will give you light.”*

## READING 2

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

As Jesus passed by, he saw a man blind from birth.  
His disciples asked him,

*“Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents,  
that he was born blind?”*

Jesus answered:

*“Neither he nor his parents sinned;  
it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him.*

*We have to do the works of the one who sent me while it is day.  
Night is coming when no one can work.*

*While I am in the world, I am the light of the world.”*

When he had said this, he spat on the ground  
and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes,  
and said to him, *“Go wash in the Pool of Siloam”* —which means Sent—.  
So he went and washed, and came back able to see...

Later, when Jesus heard that they had thrown him out,  
he found him and said, *“Do you believe in the Son of Man?”*

He answered and said,

*“Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?”*

Jesus said to him,

*“You have seen him,  
the one speaking with you is he.”*

He said, *“I do believe, Lord,”* and he worshiped him.

Then Jesus said,

*“I came into this world for judgment,  
so that those who do not see might see,  
and those who do see might become blind.”*
